# Automated Speed Enforcement Devices: Old Richmond Road Contract No. CP001001

## CONSTRUCTION

August 2025

Dear Resident.

In August, the City of Ottawa will be commencing construction to support the installation of Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) cameras as part of the City's Road Safety Action Plan.

What: The contractor will be performing work within the right of way, which includes:

- · Removal of asphalt, sidewalk, and excavation locally to install buried electrical conduit;
- Excavation and installation of electrical chambers;
- Installation of an electrical disconnect foundation;
- Reinstatement of all roadways, sidewalks, and boulevards to existing condition.
  Boulevards impacted to have topsoil and sod applied.

A separate contractor will be responsible for installing the ASE equipment including the foundation, mounting hardware and camera unit. This work will occur after underground work is completed.

Hydro Ottawa will install a new pole for the power source.

The City's Traffic Operations staff will install pole mounted electrical disconnect.

Why: This work is being done to support the installation of Automated Speed Enforcement cameras within community safety zones, generally near schools or other locations with

vulnerable road users to reduce speeding and improve safety.

Where: There are a total of 23 ASE cameras being installed as part of this project in 2025.

The ASE in your neighbourhood will be located on:

Old Richmond Road south of Seyton Drive.

Work will take place on the east side of Old Richmond Road between Seyton Drive and Sanibel Private. The work will include buried conduits and electrical disconnect installation behind the sidewalk. The topsoil and sod will be reinstated.

When:

Construction is planned to begin in August and be completed by mid-November 2025. The contractor will be using this duration to complete all 23 sites. The duration in your neighbourhood is expected to be five days.

Who: The City of Ottawa has retained the contractor, In-Depth Contracting, to complete the work.

#### Accessibility

Accessibility is an important consideration for the City of Ottawa. The City makes every effort to provide access through and around construction sites. ### **Traffic management**

To accommodate the proposed construction, there may be lane closures and localized disruption to traffic.

Access to private properties, in addition to pedestrian and cycling access, will be maintained throughout the construction period.

#### On-street parking and local access

As the various activities are in progress, on-street parking may be restricted. Local access will be maintained to residents, business owners and emergency vehicles.
